6. KeNIC at Domain Days Dubai 2025







October, KeNIC participated in Domain Days Dubai 2025, engaging global industry leaders and strengthening international partnerships. KeNIC also featured in the conference programme with a session highlighting the role of domain naming, local digital infrastructure, and access initiatives in advancing Africa's digital growth. A major highlight was the launch of a global online auction for four ultra-short .KE domain hacks—zu.ke, si.ke, le.ke, and lo.ke—showcasing the growing global appeal of the .KE namespace. Throughout the event, the team engaged in discussions on domain management, cybersecurity, and digital infrastructure, reinforcing KeNIC's role in Africa's digital transformation.

The summit also advanced strategic collaborations led by CEO and Chief Evangelist Andrew Mwanyota Lewela and Commercial & Partnerships Manager Eric Ndungu, strengthening the global presence of the .KE brand. Looking ahead, KeNIC will co-host Domain Summit Africa 2026 with the London Domain Summit, further supporting Africa's digital connectivity and domain ecosystem.

7. KeNIC at the Mobile World Congress 2025

October, a training and peer learning session on DNS and ccTLD processes was held during the MWC Kigali event, with KeNIC represented by our Finance & Strategy Manager, CPA Hildah Maina. The session equipped African governments, regulators, and national agencies to better manage critical Internet infrastructure, including ccTLDs and DNS Security Extensions (DNSSEC).

The six-day AGM brought together global Internet stakeholders to showcase ICANN's work, enhance public engagement, and expand capacity-building opportunities, providing Kenya a platform to influence discussions shaping the future of the global Domain Name System.

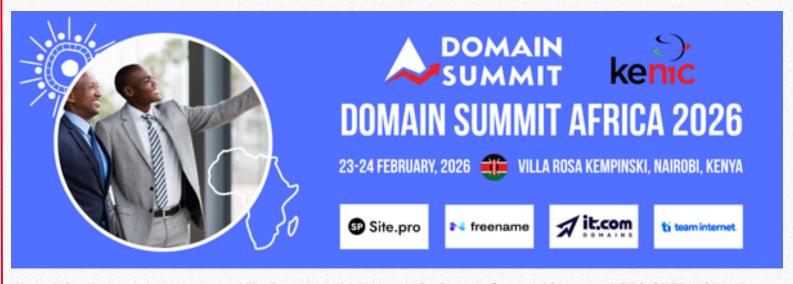
