STATEMENT FROM THE CEO – UPDATES

“As we close the second quarter of 2026, KeNIC continues to build on the strong momentum achieved at the beginning of the year. Following a successful Q1 characterized by growth in domain registrations, renewals, and overall revenue performance, our focus has remained on sustaining growth, strengthening governance, and positioning the organization for long-term success. We have also continued investing in our people, systems, and partnerships to ensure we remain agile and responsive in a dynamic digital environment.

During Q2, we intensified our efforts towards achieving our strategic growth targets. We strengthened our performance culture by emphasizing measurable outcomes, accountability, and collaboration across teams. Significant progress was also made in our ERP implementation journey, enhancement of data protection and governance initiatives, and preparations for Universal Acceptance activities aimed at promoting digital inclusion and multilingual internet access.

Key Areas of Focus in Q2 were:

- Accelerating .KE domain growth and market adoption.
- Strengthening data protection, governance, and compliance.
- Advancing ERP implementation and digital transformation initiatives.

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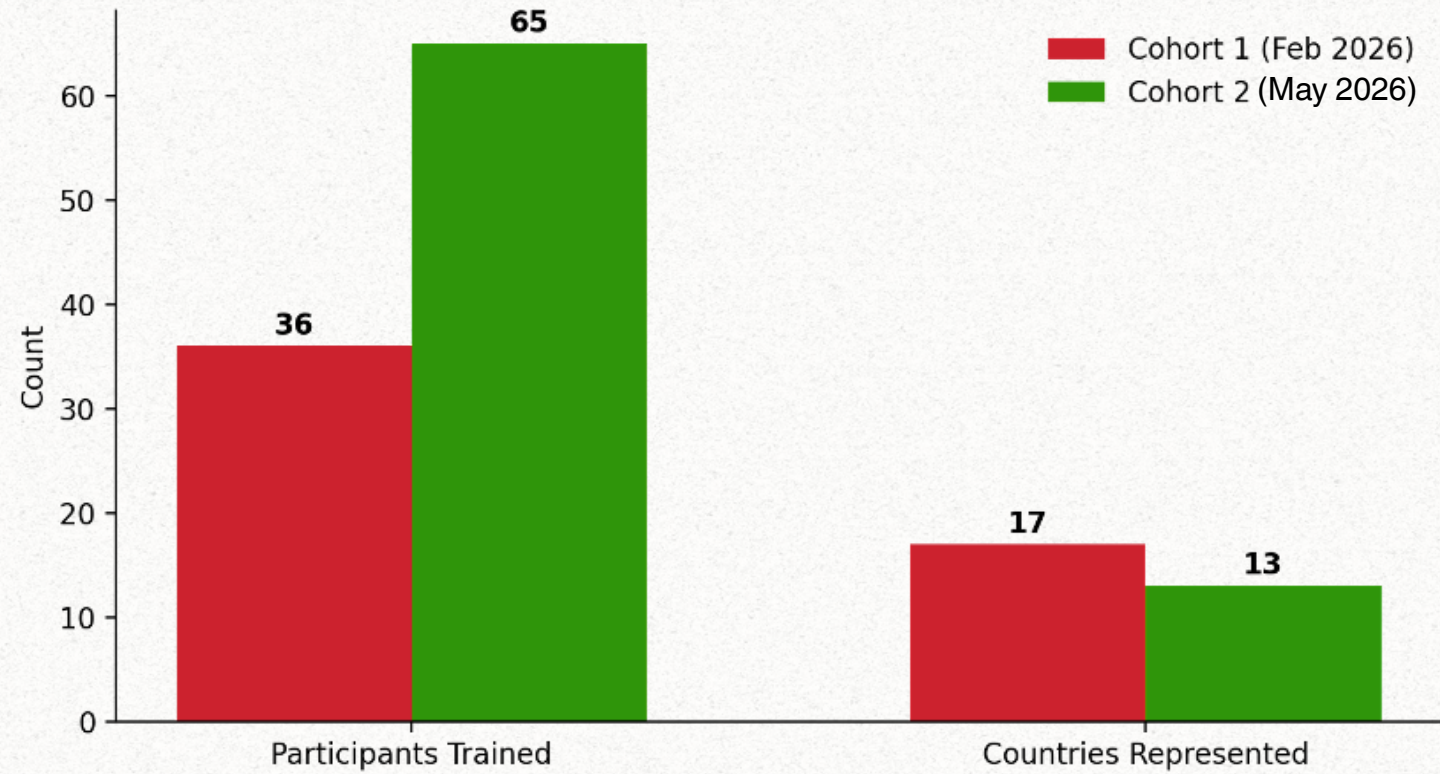

Cohort 1 & Cohort 2 Recap: Training Africa's Top ccTLDs

Following Cohort 1's success, the KeNIC × AFRALTI ccTLD Capacity Development Programme returned for Cohort 2 with even greater reach — drawing more registry managers and DNS operators from across Africa to build skills in registry operations, DNS security, and ccTLD management. Together, the two cohorts have grown the programme into a pan-African platform strengthening the continent's digital infrastructure, guided by three core objectives: equipping registrars with the skills to manage domain registration, comply with regulations, and deliver strong customer service; building ccTLD knowledge among government agencies; and training the wider community in ccTLD operations.

1. CEO Participates in Mediation Summit 2026

4. KeNIC Announces Leadership Transition at Board Level

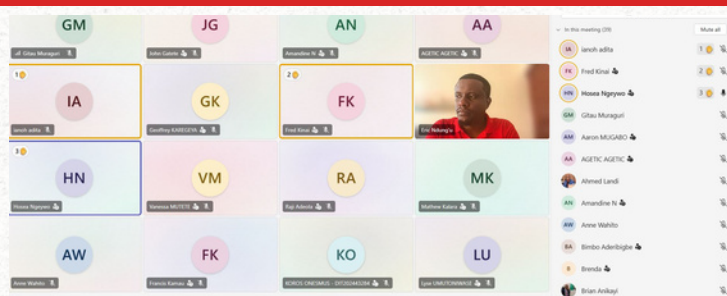
- Mr. Paul Kariuki concluded his tenure as Chairperson of the KeNIC Board of Directors, having served since October 5th, 2023.
